FROM PASTOR LISA

Does anyone still make New Year's resolutions? Sometimes the New Year comes with pressure to change ourselves, but we don't have to spend time wishing we were different. Instead of asking what should I fix about myself, we can ask where is God already at work—in me, in my neighbors, in this community? And we can celebrate the little ways that God is made known to us.

The new year isn't about becoming someone new. It's about living more fully into who we are in Christ. That matters in a world that feels exhausted, divided, and uncertain. The good news is **not** that we can save ourselves by trying harder. The good news is that God meets us right where we are—tired, hopeful, grieving, grateful—and loves us right where we are.

As you begin this year, rather than make resolutions, you can make traditions, thinking about the ways God has been with you during the previous year. What were the high points and what were the low points last year? What good did God bring into your life, especially in the difficult times?

And traditions like spending time looking toward this coming year and thinking about how you might take small, faithful steps toward loving your neighbors and caring about the well-being of people across the planet? Can you come up with one thing you can do to share kindness with someone you know? Can you come up with one way you can bring some kindness to this world in general, even if it's simply through prayer. That's a tradition worthy of the New Year.

All Members were present at the meeting held November 11, 2025. The October minutes were approved.

The October Financial Report was reviewed, and a donation was received from the Estate of Marion Speilvogel of Watertown for \$10,000. Financial Report was Approved.

Candy talked to Owen about the hour increase for Pastor. Also found out that the second signer for the bank account is Dennis W. Candy also worked the Food Pantry on 10/15/2025 and served 8 Families.

Pastor discussed the kitchen outlets for using Nesco's, Slow Cooker's and Coffee pot. She found out the outlets cannot be overloaded and need to spread things out. Pastor found her contract and emailed the Bishop and asked how we go about a contract change. Cind Wortruba has agreed to be on the Church Council. Kathy Deneen agreed to head the service on Wednesday November 19th. Hailey Martin will have First Communion. Residence for pregnant woman updated. Thinking of a giving tree, People could take a tag and bring back the item. Pastor talked about Continuing Ed and was wondering if she could roll over the hours, since she didn't need to use them all. This was approved by council, and she is thinking of taking a creative writing course.

David Kiersten has agreed to be our maintenance person, and Gary will talk to Dave on whether he will agree to \$15.00 per hour.

Christmas Eve Service was agreed to be at 7pm with a possibility to rotate every other year to 5pm with St. Marks. Pastor will speak to their congregation to see if they would be willing to rotate also. The Fire pit from the Garage has gone missing. Ask the Boy Scouts about this and put a message in the Bulletin. Kathy Deneen talked to the Girls Scouts, and they would like to donate \$75.00 to the Church. It was mentioned that Toner and paper are always needed. Replacement folding chairs are needed. Karen and Candy will work in getting pricing for these. A motion was made and approved to move \$5,000 to the Building Fund from the \$10,000 that was sent to us by the Estate. Annual meeting is on January 25th right after church. Kathy S stated that WELCA are asking about rides to church for those in need. And to put a note in the Bulletin. Kathy S mentioned the gift cards that are in the office, maybe use some of the gift cards for gifts during the bingo game in March. Meeting ended in prayer and adjourned.

Simply Giving is an easy-to-use and trusted platform for you to give money online through electronic giving. This program allows you to set up automatic, monthly withdrawals from your bank account. You can get the form from the church office, fill it out, and return it to the office.

PLANNED GIVING TO HOLY TRINITY

1. One way to ensure a bright future for our church is to make a planned gift that names HOLY TRINITY **in your will**. A bequest is a meaningful way to support the church's ministry without affecting your cash flow during your lifetime. Your attorney can include it when you prepare or revise your will, or you can add a codicil at any time.
2. Gifts that do not restrict their use (**unrestricted gifts**), allow Holy Trinity to use these resources where they are most needed.
3. **Restricted gifts** are monies designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, such as support to a specific initiative or program.
4. Give to the church's **Endowment Fund**. You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An **endowment gift** helps move us into a more sustainable position. (Dan Timpel has joined the Endowment Committee, replacing Jack Erb. If anyone has questions or wants to make a donation to this fund or the Memorial Fund, they should contact Dan Timpel, Todd Madaus, or Owen Raisbeck.)
5. You could also choose to designate **a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity** each year. We are grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.
6. Naming Holy Trinity **as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy** can convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.

Quilts for LWR As quilt-making continues here at Holy Trinity, we always have an ongoing need for the supplies that go into making the quilts. Thank you to all our members and friends who keep an eye out for fabric that family members are disposing of and fabric that is available at garage sales and estate sales. We continue to request new bed sheets, used bed sheets, tablecloths, large pieces of fabric, etc. Even well-worn sheets are useful as the middle layer of a quilt. We welcome anyone who wants to get involved in making quilts either by meeting at church, by sewing at home or by cutting fabric squares at home.

One of our quilt groups meets at church 12:30 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of each month to sort donations, prepare donations for use in a quilt, and tie the layers of a quilt together. Our other quilt group comes to church on the 3rd Saturday of each month starting at 9:00 am. Sewing machines will be provided.

Please join in various quilt tasks on our quilt days for whatever amount of time you have to contribute. We are grateful for all the support we receive from our Holy Trinity family that allows us to donate quilts to the Lutheran World Relief mission of providing quilts to people in need in the US and around the world. **Please continue to provide new fabric that can be cut into squares for making quilts. It's then possible for someone to take the next step and cut 11-inch squares of fabric and donate them. **

ELCA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. Per Constitution and bylaws of the ELCA, a person must give a monetary gift and receive Holy Communion at least once every calendar year to be a member. Holy Trinity is required to keep records of both giving and communion. (If you put cash in the collection plate, which is not a contribution of record. We need to know if your contribution came from you. There are extra contribution envelopes on the Welcome Desk in case you need one.) Please fill out a communion card at least once a year and on the day that you commune. That way we can make a record of it. Place your last name and first name of each person taking Communion on the card along with the date. You may place the card in the offering plate or hand it to an usher. You may also request a visit from the Pastor on this card.
