FROM PASTOR LISA

Let me tell you something about myself. I don't like being told what to do. At a very young age, my mom told me something like: "We don't do that here." To which I replied, "I'm not from here."

So imagine my reaction when at seminary, we were told we had to give away 10% of our income. My defenses automatically went up. Not because this wasn't a good idea. It's called a tithe in the Bible. It's just that I don't like being told what to do.

Of course, I had always put money in the offering plate, but just a little here and a little there. Then I was called to a church in rural Wisconsin where for the first time, I had a real salary. It was time to write some checks.

I thought I'd resent it, but instead I felt joy flowing through my pen and onto those checks. I felt joy, not because I was doing what I was told or doing the right thing, not even because I was helping others. But because I was letting go of my desire to keep what I thought was "mine."

As I wrote those checks, I felt released from that instinct to guard what I considered mine. The joy was in knowing I could give something away and not be less for it, that I was more than my money or my belongings or my job. And that God was in charge of my life, including my financial life.

Fortunately, I developed the habit of giving early in my adult life--because there have been times when I feared not having enough. Without that habit, I would have had trouble giving that much of my income away because there were bills to pay and children to provide for. By writing those checks, my husband and I learned we could give and still have enough.

Now, I worry more about having enough for the future, for retirement. But I have this habit of giving to fall back on. I don't write checks anymore. I use PayPal or simply giving or online banking to share my money with my congregations and nonprofits that help those without adequate food or housing.

Online giving isn't as satisfying as writing checks, but I don't have to worry about not getting it done. These days, it's better to rely on automatic giving than my own memory, especially in the summer when life is full of fun things to do, and I'm not always thinking about my routines. Plus, summer is a time when most congregations experience a significant drop in giving yet still have bills to pay.

Every little bit counts for congregations these days, and no matter how much you give, your congregation exists because of your generosity. Thank you for remembering Holy Trinity, summer, fall, winter and spring! Blessings to you all.

PLANNED GIVING TO HOLY TRINITY

- 1. One way to ensure a bright future for our church is to make a planned gift that names HOLY TRINITY **in your will**. A bequest is a meaningful way to support the church's ministry without affecting your cash flow during your lifetime. Your attorney can include it when you prepare or revise your will, or you can add a codicil at any time.
- 2. Gifts that do not restrict their use (unrestricted gifts), allow Holy Trinity to use these resources where they are most needed.
- 3. **Restricted gifts** are monies designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, such as support to a specific initiative or program.
- 4. Give to the church's Endowment Fund. You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An endowment gift helps move us into a more sustainable position. (Dan Timpel has joined the Endowment Committee, replacing Jack Erb. If anyone has questions or wants to make a donation to this fund or the Memorial Fund they should contact Dan Timpel, Todd Madaus, or Owen Raisbeck.)
- 5. You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We are grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.
- 6. Naming Holy Trinity **as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy** can convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.

Quilts for LWR As quilt-making continues here at Holy Trinity, we always have an ongoing need for the supplies that go into making the quilts. Thank you to all our members and friends who keep an eye out for fabric that family members are disposing of and fabric that is available at garage sales and estate sales. We continue to request new bed sheets, used bed sheets, tablecloths, large pieces of fabric, etc. Even well-worn sheets are useful as the middle layer of a quilt. We welcome anyone who wants to get involved in making quilts either by meeting at church, by sewing at home or by cutting fabric squares at home.

One of our quilt groups meets at church 12:30 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of each month to sort donations, prepare donations for use in a quilt, and tie the layers of a quilt together. Our other quilt group comes to church on the 3rd Saturday of each month starting at 9:00 am. Sewing machines will be provided.

Please join in various quilt tasks on our quilt days for whatever amount of time you have to contribute. We are grateful for all the support we receive from our Holy Trinity family that allows us to donate quilts to the Lutheran World Relief mission of providing quilts to people in need in the US and around the world. **Please continue to provide new fabric that can be cut into squares for making quilts. It's then possible for someone to take the next step and cut 11-inch squares of fabric and donate them. **

ELCA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. Per Constitution and bylaws of the ELCA, a person must give a monetary gift and receive Holy Communion at least once every calendar year to be a member. Holy Trinity is required to keep records of both giving and communion. (If you put cash in the collection plate, which is not a contribution of record. We need to know if your contribution came from you. There are extra contribution envelopes on the Welcome Desk in case you need one.) Please fill out a communion card at least once a year and on the day that you commune. That way we can make a record of it. Place your last name and first name of each person taking Communion on the card along with the date. You may place the card in the offering plate or hand it to an usher. You may also request a visit from the Pastor on this card.
