I like Christmas season as much as the next person, which is quite a lot. At the same time, I really enjoy the season of Advent. Advent spans the four weeks leading up to December 25. In other words, it's not Christmas yet; it's Advent. In the Christian Church, Christmas begins on December 25<sup>th</sup> and doesn't end until January 6<sup>th</sup>. This is where the notion of 12 days of Christmas comes from. So, when the rest of the world has stopped playing Christmas music on December 26<sup>th</sup>, the party has just gotten rolling in the Church.

Advent is about taking the time to be deliberate about preparing for the celebration of Christ's birth, as well as the promise that Christ will come again. *You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We have been very grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.
