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PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear friends,

Holy Trinity is in a time of transition. Some of the changes are those that occur on a regular basis; some are those that only come periodically.

The regular transitions come just like new seasons – Summer into Autumn into Winter, into Spring. In the Christian Church we are approaching the end of the Church Year. Christ the King Sunday (November 21st this year) is the final day of the Church Calendar. We then begin the Church's new year with the Season of Advent during which we prepare for Christmas, the celebration of the birth of Christ.

This will be marked by a change to blue paraments on the altar, as well as a focus on the basics of the Christian faith. One concrete change here at Holy Trinity will be worship on Wednesday evenings. Wednesday worship is usually a repeat of the previous Sunday worship with the same bible verses, music, and sermon. The Wednesday worship during Advent will be its own service, different from Sunday and intended as an additional worship for the entire congregation. I encourage you to make the time for this worship, not as another item on an already too busy schedule, but as a time to slow down from the busy shuffle and rest in God's goodness.

Another transition that doesn't happen on a regular basis is the time "between pastors", the interim time. Having said goodbye to your previous pastor, your church is now in a time of assessment of where the church is at spiritually and discerning where God is leading you. These are the things that will help determine who your next called pastor will be.

A Call Committee has been formed and will be meeting with a representative from our Synod Office on November 7th to begin the process of assessment and, ultimately, interviewing and calling a new pastor.

These can seem like tumultuous and uneasy times for a congregation. Rest assured that Christ is still present and hard at work with you, shaping a future for your faith, ministry, and service to the world. I'm pleased to accompany you in this process!

Confirmation classes continue November 3, 10, and 17 at 5:00 pm at the church. (There will be no confirmation class on Wednesday – November 24.) We are gathering in person (YAY!) and following any COVID protocols which may be in place. We are focusing on the Apostles' Creed this year using a fun curriculum called re:form. It uses humor, hands-on experiences, and general silliness to dig into deep aspects of the Christian faith. Kids will receive an "AntiWorkbook" which will be tattered, stapled, glued, drawn in, and quite effective throughout our time together. A detailed schedule has been sent to families and is posted on the bulletin board in the narthex.

Save the date! Families, Sunday School students will be putting on a Christmas pageant this year!! The date will be **Sunday, December 12th** during the 10:00 service as it has been in previous years. We will begin practicing and learning the story mid-November. The pageant is a great chance for the kids to not only get more familiar with the Christmas story, but also to work as a team in a new way and have fun exploring costumes & props.

The older kids have been taking a deeper dive into themes like creation and the flood and have been sharing some beautiful artworks with us on the table by the Sunday School bulletin board so be sure to check them out!

For the younger kids, we have been exploring the stories of the Old Testament beginning with Abraham's family and moving through the years from Issaac to Jacob and Joseph. In each lesson we get up and move with a fun activity, learn the story, and end with an engaging craft.

PLANNED GIVING TO HOLY TRINITY

One way to ensure a bright future for our church is to make a planned gift that names HOLY TRINITY in your will. A bequest is a meaningful way to support the church's ministry without affecting your cash flow during your lifetime. Your attorney can include it when you prepare or revise your will, or you can add a codicil at any time.

*Gifts that do not restrict their use, or **unrestricted gifts**, allow Holy Trinity to use these resources where they are most needed. Of course we are also grateful for gifts that are designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, **restricted gifts**, such as support to a specific initiative or program. Or you could make a gift to the church's Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An **endowment gift** helps move us into a more sustainable position.*

You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We have been very grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift. You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund.

Another way to help Holy Trinity is to name the church as the beneficiary of your life insurance policy. This could convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.


