FROM PASTOR LISA

With the wind chill, it was -20 at church on Sunday, Jan 19th. Even though I'm from Fresno, I've lived in Wisconsin for 31 years. I'm fully midwesternized, but I can't believe I live where the air hurts your face. During my first winter in Wisconsin, the weatherperson said, "If you go outside without a hat, you'll lose your ears." I thought twice about going outside where the air was that dangerous. Fortunately, I've gotten used to the exaggerations of weatherpersons, and I wear hats.

Through my other congregation, St Mark's, I have gotten to know some homeless people. I really can't imagine how cold they must be. Many of them are unable to work because of developmental limitations or mental health challenges. Some of them are unable to stay in shelters because of their anxiety. Shelters can be very rough places. I know a couple of people who sleep in their cars year around. They don't sleep much in this cold and have to turn on their car to get some heat. The biggest risk is running out of gas.

Jesus said, For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger, and you welcomed me. I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick, and you took care of me. I was in prison, and you visited me" (Matthew 25:35-36). I think we could also say, "I was homeless, and you gave me a safe place to call home. I was suffering, and you took care of me. I was isolated, and you visited me." We know how to give people food and water, but that's not enough to stay alive. People need to know that someone cares, and they need community.

St Mark's can provide food and community because other congregations support them with monetary donations, food drives, and volunteers. But St Mark's isn't the only one who helps those in need. Half of the donations we send to the synod office, called benevolences, get sent on to the ELCA office, and the ELCA has many ways of helping others. Lutheran World Relief and Lutheran Disaster Relief are two organizations that respond to emergencies in this country and others. Some of the money we send to the synod and ELCA offices makes its way to there. Monetary donations to the synod and ELCA offices also support health care initiatives that provide important health measures.

Both the righteous and the unrighteous asked Jesus the same questions. "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" (Matthew 25:37-39). Neither realized that when they did this for anyone, they did it for Jesus. *Pastor Lisa*

When a few responded to the email and asked what she needed, the imposter said she had 5 members hospitalized with cancer and needed gift cards to be purchased. Fortunately no one fell for this scam

The proposed budget for 2025 of \$110,203 was presented and approved without any questions. The large jump from 2024 to 2025 was due to the increase in insurance for our building.

Matt Stensven and Kathy Deneen were elected to fill the Council positions being vacated by Larry Legro and Karen Browne. Larry and Karen were thanked for their service on the Council. (Election of Council officers will take place at the next Council meeting on Tuesday – February 11.)

There was an appeal for weekly teams to usher/read. Those weekly worship helper teams are now filled, at least until May when confirmation happens.

An appeal was made for more Holy Trinity members to become involved in fundraising and other events at the church as the same people are currently stepping up every time. The Event Planning Committee is in need of a new Chairperson as Stephanie Woodley has moved. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday – February 12 at 6:30 pm. Please come and join in for discussion and planning. Suggestions are always welcome.

Our current property insurance is \$19,000 per year with a \$25,000 deductible. Larry Legro will be looking into finding a better plan.

Larry Legro said he would be willing to continue as the lay leader in Pastor Lisa's absence for Wednesday worship and Sundays when supply pastors can't be found.

Kathy Schluter is currently acting as office manager until Karen Browne can take over sometime in April.

Of course, we are also grateful for gifts that are designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission **(restricted gifts)**, such as support to a specific initiative or program. Or you could make a gift to the church's Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An **endowment gift** helps move us into a more sustainable position.

You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We have been grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.

You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund.

Another way to help Holy Trinity is to name the church as the beneficiary of your life insurance policy. This could convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.

Quilts for LWR As quilt-making continues here at Holy Trinity, we always have an ongoing need for the supplies that go into making the quilts. Thank you to all our members and friends who keep an eye out for fabric that family members are disposing of and fabric that is available at garage sales and estate sales. We continue to request new bed sheets, used bed sheets, tablecloths, large pieces of fabric, etc. Even well-worn sheets are useful as the middle layer of a quilt. We welcome anyone who wants to get involved in making quilts either by meeting at church, by sewing at home or by cutting fabric squares at home.

One of our quilt groups meets at church 12:30 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of each month to sort donations, prepare donations for use in a quilt, and tie the layers of a quilt together. Our other quilt group comes to church on the 3rd Saturday of each month starting at 9:00 am. Sewing machines will be provided.

Please join in various quilt tasks on our quilt days for whatever amount of time you have to contribute. We are grateful for all the support we receive from our Holy Trinity family that allows us to donate quilts to the Lutheran World Relief mission of providing quilts to people in need in the US and around the world. **Please continue to provide new fabric that can be cut into squares for making quilts. It's then possible for someone to take the next step and cut 11-inch squares of fabric and donate them. **

ELCA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. Per Constitution and bylaws of the ELCA, a person must give a monetary gift and receive Holy Communion at least once every calendar year to be a member. Holy Trinity is required to keep records of both giving and communion. (If you put cash in the collection plate, that is not a contribution of record. We need to know your contribution came from you. (There are extra contribution envelopes on the Welcome Desk.) Please fill out a communion card at least once a year and on the day that you commune. That way we can make a record of it. Place your last name and first name of each person taking Communion on the card along with the date. You may place the card in the offering plate or hand it to an usher. You may also request a visit from the Pastor on this card.
